THE WHOLE CHILD

Over the past few years, schools have emphasized the importance of educating students to be proficient in more than academic skills in order to allow them to take their place as active citizens. Many studies show that a comprehensive approach to teaching and learning works best. The relationship between student health and success in school, for example, is clear. Students do better academically when they are physically active. Additionally, school connectedness (feeling part of one's school and feeling close to people at school) positively correlates with grades in many school subjects. Parents want schools to teach their children to be trustworthy, good citizens, critical thinkers and display positive behavior. How can we as a school community ensure that all students master not only academic and technology skills, but also develop those qualities and skills that will enable them to contribute meaningfully to the needs of future societies?

Within our school community, we are answering this question by implementing many new initiatives. New challenging and engaging curriculum in academics and technologies have been instituted including a new Health and Wellness curriculum in physical education and health. An increased number of 10th grade students have reached proficiency in the CT Physical Fitness assessments that were administered for this year. In reaching out to our community, The National Honor Society sponsored a winter food drive and SkillsUSA recently held a second blood drive and a Bowl-a-thon to raise funds to purchase bears for pediatric patients. A Peer Leadership training for 20 Vinal students will help to further our efforts to have students work with their peers to promote understanding and display caring, respectful behavior. The establishment of a Check-In Connect program and Student Advisories ensure that students have the opportunity to connect with an adult and access the support they need. To promote pro-social behaviors and attitudes as part of our character education programming, a Teen Leadership class is scheduled for all freshmen and sophomores and a Career Development class for juniors to recognize productive workplace skills and ethics. A counseling and tutoring component has been added to the Student Achievement Intervention Lab to foster student responsibility.

This year continues to bring many exciting changes and opportunities. We encourage you to share your ideas with principals, teachers and the PFO, to work together with our school community.

VINAL AND PLATT TECH TEAM UP FOR PEER LEADERSHIP TRAINING

In the spirit of true collaboration, Vinal Technical High School and Platt Technical High School took part in a joint peer training program in association with *The World of Difference Institute of the Anti-Defamation League*. Thirty eight students and four advisors from Vinal and Platt were involved in three days of training as Peer Trainers. Since 1991, over 10,000 students across the country have been trained as Peer Trainers who impact thousands of other students.

Many opportunities were provided to the participants to discuss events occurring in their schools and communities related to prejudice, stereotyping, discrimination and violence. The Peer Trainers learned how to respond effectively when they hear racial slurs, name calling and put downs in the hallways, lunchrooms and class rooms of their schools. The students will assume leadership roles in their schools in an effort to create respectful and inclusive school environments.

Additionally, the program provided the Peer Leadership Trainers with resources to design and lead interactive programs for their peers and younger students that will encourage respectful, safe schools and communities. Vinal students are planning to bring anti-bias programming to the students at elementary and middle schools in the local communities of Middletown, Middlefield and Durham.

One of the best outcomes from this experience is the camaraderie established among the group of students from these two technical high schools.

TECHNOLOGY NEWS

Carpentry - Congratulations to Mr. Zavodjancik on his many years of service and we wish him well in his retirement. Welcome to Mr. Bisson the new carpentry instructor. Currently, the shop is finishing up 2 production projects. A cabinet, radiator covers and a porch landing will soon be finished for Mr. Wich of Old Saybrook. Mr. Vagell is also receiving 6 aerobic platforms built by carpentry to keep our student body healthy. With plenty of calls for production work outside the school, it looks like the shop will be on production during the spring

Electrical – 9th grade Electrical Exploratory classes are studying energy efficiency. An innovative **Energy Efficiency** program is being implemented by Mrs. Juan in the Electrical Department for freshmen attending the six day exploratory classes. As part of this program, the freshmen are building solar powered cars, boats, elevators, and cranes to introduce various types of power generation. A field trip to the Smart Living Center in Orange, CT provides an opportunity for the students to perform hands on experiments with power generation and learn about energy efficiency. Mr. Zisk and the seniors have been collaborating with the Drafting and Carpentry Departments to install an actual solar panel on the roof of the school to demonstrate another type of power generation.

ACADEMIC NEWS

General Education – The Wesleyan Humanities program for the juniors begins its 39th year on February 8, 2008. The program is a consortium of five area high schools: Vinal, Middletown Xavier, Mercy and Haddam-Killingworth who meet together for six seminar days at Wesleyan University to hear a notable professor lecture at the Russell House and to watch a related film at the Center For Film Studies in the afternoon. The first lecture will open with Professor Andrew Szedy-Maszek, an expert on Greek classical literature at Wesleyan. The students have prepared by reading *The Odyssey* by Homer and by reading numerous articles about the Mycenaean civilization. Homer's epic classic "comes alive" during Professor Szedy-Maszek's witty analysis of the text. The afternoon film is

"Oh Brother, where art thou?"

Preparations for the CAPT test have been ongoing during the fall and winter months. Freshmen and sophomore students have been practicing their respective academic classes by writing answers to the latest State released materials. Our confidence is high that our students understand the expectations of CAPT, and they have mastered the strategies for successful answers for the reading, writing, math and science sections of the test.

Related Education – Mathematics Department – Mr. McCarthy's Honors Algebra 1 class will be conducting research for the XXIX Olympiad in Beijing, China. The games are scheduled to begin on 08/08/08.

The students will examine the websites of the Olympics and Central Intelligence Agency (CIA). The students will record the medals earned in the 2004 Olympics in Athens by the USA and 3 additional countries. Using their computer skills, the students will explore the CIA's World Factbook to determine the development of these 4 countries in specific categories.

Following this research, the students will use their graphing skills to create nine graphs comparing the data they collected. This data will then be summarized in a paragraph. The students will be asked to reflect on their project to determine 'Is there any relationship between the development of the country and that country's success in earning medals in the Olympics?'

Science Department- Vinal 10th graders science students and teachers have CAPT on the brain. Last trimester ended with the completion of the Synthetic Polymers CAPT embedded lab, and this cycle the main focus has been the Solar Cooker lab. This task goes along with the curriculum embedded tasks on Energy. Students have been discussing sources of energy in their class, including ways that we can conserve nonrenewable resources. Nonrenewable resources include fossil fuels such as propane, oil and gasoline, which we of course use for heat, cooking and transportation. There are many ways that the students have learned to conserve these fuels, for example, set thermostats lower, use electric powered or push lawn mowers, and hybrid cars. Another alternative is to use renewable energy resources such as the wind and the sun. This is where the Solar Cooker comes in. The task for the students is to see what kind of coverings (heat conductors), such as aluminum foil and black paper can be used on plastic bottles to heat water using solar or heat lamp power. Here at Vinal we are lucky to have the PASCO equipment, which can be used to monitor the changes in temperature using a thermometer probe hooked up via USB to the computer. This type of technology makes the experience all the more real to the students!

STUDENT COUNCIL NEWS

The Student Council is sponsoring a service drive consisting of a collection of multiple brands of box tops in conjunction with a program called "**Box Tops for Education**" In this program, elementary and middle schools can turn in the box tops for supplies and equipment for their schools. High schools are not eligible but we are sponsoring this service drive for elementary and middle schools in Connecticut. Last year, these box tops were sent down South to schools that were affected by Hurricane Katrina. A list that includes hundreds of products from cereals to paper products to frozen foods has been included on the last page of this newsletter.
