We are pleased to inform you that Connecticut Technical Education and Career System will be implementing a program available to schools participating in the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Programs called the **Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)**.

All enrolled students of the Connecticut Technical Education and Career System are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at **no cost** to your household each day of the school year. Your children will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submit a meal application.
